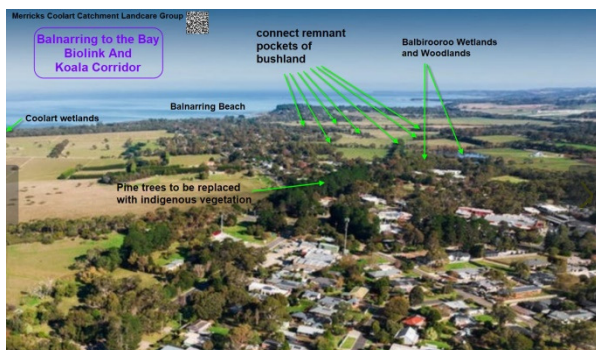


Balnarring to the Bay Biolink Project
